Publishing Activities

Center's Publications

1) Bulletin Current Human Rights Issues (issued in Czech)

The Center issues a monthly bulletin *Current Human Rights Issues* which provides information and short analysis of human rights related issues and which is divided into four sections: International Criminal Justice, European systém of Human Rights Protection, International Politics and Human Rights, Czech Republic and Human Rights. In the period from September 2011 to August 2012 eleven bulletin were published (9 to 12/2011, 1 to 7-8/2012).

2) Czech Republic Human Rights Review (issued in English)

The Center has also prepared one issue of *Czech Republic Human Rights Review* to be published in the end of the year 2012 at latest. Its aim is to present information about development of human rights in the Czech Republic and in Slovakia.

3) ENAR (The European Network Against Racism) Report

The Shadow Report on the State of Racism and Dicrimination in the Czech Republic is annually published by a non-governmental organization ENAR that maps racism and racial discrimination in all the EU countries. Every year a national authorial team is approached and asked to handle the topic of racism and discrimination from the non-governmental sector point of view and create a national shadow report. Based on the national reports ENAR then draws up a Shadow Report on the State of Racism and Discrimination in the EU. The Center is the author of the Czech national report for the period 2011/2012. In this period a special theme of islamophobia was reflected. The Shadow Report will be published on www.enar-eu.org by the end of the year 2012.

In the academic year 2011/2012 the Center successfully applied for two grants at the total value of 79 230 Czech crowns. The first grant was acquired within the Masaryk University rector program part of which was also support of creation of student journals. Due to this grant the Center rewarded authors of articles published in monthly bulletin *Current Human Rights Issues*, ensured sustainability of the bulletin and especially paid for the creationg of a logo and own website which is planned to be launched in October 2012. The second grant received from the scholarship program of the Faculty of Social Science of Masaryk University in support of cultural and club activities. Due to it a seminar "Elections From the View of Their Observers" was held.
